

Statement of Attainment in Chemical Risk Management

Details

TAFE NSW Course No: 10105

Description

This course will provide the knowledge and skills required to plan, implement and manage the risk of a chemical control program. You will learn to evaluate, minimise and monitor the risks involved with chemical use programs and establish an equipment calibration procedure.

On successful completion of this course, you will meet the training requirements determined by the Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority for the purchase of some restricted chemicals and the NSW Pesticides Regulation 2009 for the unsupervised application of pesticides.

***Key to Attendance modes**

Full Time- Enrolments with 540 or more total Annual Student Hours (ASH) in a given course. This represents a weekly study attendance of between 15 and 30 hours.
